Term 2 at Yakamia is a very musical one! The whole school, K-6, will participate in the **Acknowledgement Song Project** by Gina Williams and Guy Ghouse. This is being organised by Breaksea, the City of Albany with Heathway.

In Week 1 Pia and Rachel from Breaksea came to teach us the chorus of the song. We began with a welcome from Uncle Lester, who was very impressed with our singing.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

The Acknowledgement Song Project offers a unique opportunity for Primary Schools to play a meaningful role leading up to Albany 2026, by singing and acknowledging the Menang Noongar people.

Created by the award-winning composers of Wanjoo, Gina Williams and Guy Ghouse, this new "Acknowledgement of Country" song has been specially written for the children of the Lower Great Southern!

Throughout Term 2 this year, participating schools will have the chance to be part of two incursions—focused on learning the new song and featuring in the filmed music video. The song has been practised during Music lessons in preparation for the filming in week 6.

In June, the Yakamia School Choir will participate in a massed singing event at the Albany Entertainment Centre, to perform the new song alongside Gina Williams and Guy Ghouse. This event will also feature a performance of their new children's musical, Aliwah Bardinar.

On New Year's Eve, families and school communities can gather at the City of Albany's New Year's Eve event to watch the premiere of the music video, showcasing the voices of participating schools. This is a wonderful opportunity to contribute to a historic moment and leave a legacy.

On Friday 6 June, the staff from Breaksea will be visiting Yakamia to film our whole school for the Acknowledgement Song project. This will form part of the music video which will be launched at the City of Albany New Year's Eve celebrations on the foreshore and may become available to the wider public.

All students are to wear their red shirts on Friday for the filming, no House shirts. Thanks.

There's been a selection of herbs and vegies planted including carrots, beetroot, basil, strawberries, marigolds and also some succulent plants which have created a prehistoric play garden.

Just before Mother's Day, we had a go at mixing dried native flowers, leaves, gumnuts and everlastings, plus some rose petals and special oils and made some gifts.

Sustainability at Yakamia

Every week, students at Yakamia try to be more sustainable by participating in Waste Free Wednesday.



One of our initiatives is to encourage students to take home food scraps where possible and put them in the FOGO. Why bring food scraps home rather than put them in the bin at school, I hear you ask?

Lauren Goodheart is a Resource Recovery Specialist at Australian waste management company Cleanaway. She says, "Instead of sending scraps to landfill, FOGO ensures they're put to good use. When dumped at the tip, FOGO waste releases dangerous amounts of methane. By recovering food and garden waste, we can transform it into nutrient-rich compost that enriches our soil rather than contributing to harmful methane emissions. By embracing FOGO and having a 'reduce waste' mindset, we create a system where waste isn't discarded – it's given a new life."



Fostering Independence

Fostering independence in young children is essential for their overall development, particularly in strengthening cognitive abilities, motor skills, and social-emotional growth.

When children are given opportunities to take on simple responsibilities, such as carrying and unpacking their own school bag, they begin to build a sense of autonomy and self-confidence. These everyday routines enhance problem-solving and memory, while also supporting physical coordination. For instance, lifting and positioning a school bag helps develop gross motor strength and balance, while tasks like unzipping compartments and retrieving lunchboxes improve fine motor skills.



At home, independence can be fostered through activities like dressing themselves, setting the table, tidying toys, or pouring drinks under supervision. These experiences empower children to take an active role in their daily lives, nurturing qualities such as resilience, confidence, organisation, and persistence.




Kindergarten Enrolments for 2026 are OPEN!


